Overcome Borders – Gain Mobility!

Living without borders seems a commonplace these days. But not much more than a few years ago, borders were generally understood to be barriers and symbols of division, and not bridges between cultures. For most people borders were intimidating and hard to cross – free mobility was a utopian vision.

In this Workshop we will have a look at how borders appeared in the past, what they are like today and how you can overcome them in the future. As Berlin was itself a divided city, we will examine here what it was like to live with the wall, discover the remains and monuments of the Wall and discuss what impact borders have had on you.

As part of this workshop we will also make a small field trip to a current internal EU border and have a look at how people live there today. The German-Polish border is a relative

young border and it disappeared no earlier than 2007.

Based on the workshop exercises we want to discuss with you how you want to overcome borders in the future and encourage you to question the notion that borders represent barriers and separators.
